#### **Nancy Rotering**

Nancy Rotering has fought to reduce gun violence for more than a decade, including leading the Highland Park City Council in passing a municipal assault weapons and large capacity magazine ban in 2013, which withstood a legal challenge by the National Rifle Association (NRA) in federal court. In 2023, in the wake of the July 4, 2022, Highland Park shooting, the State of Illinois passed a state-wide assault weapons ban. Rotering continues to lobby for gun violence prevention at the state and federal levels.

Rotering's career experience includes working as a planning commissioner for the city of Highland Park, Illinois, and as a legislative aide. Prior to becoming mayor of Highland Park, she practiced law with McDermott Will & Emery in Chicago, focusing on healthcare fraud and abuse. She earned a bachelor's degree in economics from Stanford University, a master's degree in health service management, marketing and finance from Northwestern University Kellogg School of Management, and a juris doctor from the University of Chicago Law School. Her career experience includes work as a financial analyst in General Motors' Treasurer's Office, serving as a planning commissioner for the City of Highland Park, and working as a legislative aide for an Illinois State Representative.

In 2015, recognizing an increasing need for human services in the face of reduced resources, Rotering founded the North Suburban Legal Aid Clinic, providing free legal services and equal access for justice to northeastern Illinois residents navigating housing, immigration and domestic violence matters.

A strong proponent of advocacy and political engagement, Rotering teaches *Women and American Political Leadership* at Northwestern University and is proud to be recognized as the 2022 Outstanding Instructor by its School of Education and Social Policy (SESP). She is a member of the Northwestern Women's Board, the Council of 100, and founding chair of the women's Health Research Institute Advisory Board at Northwestern's Feinberg School of Medicine, focusing on elevating the need for basic medical research to recognize gender differences.

In 2014, *Today's Chicago Woman* named Nancy Rotering to their "100 Women of Inspiration" and *Forbes* included her in their "Forty Over 40" list. In 2022, she received the Lake County (IL) Harriet Tubman Award, the Lake County Democratic Woman Resist Award, the Blue Crescent Outreach Foundation Social Action Sapphire Award, and the New Trier Democrats Defender of Democracy Award.
